Pieces of Time - A Musical Trunk Show

Songs, Stories, Quilts

I've been writing and singing songs about quilts, the people who make them, and the ones who love them since 2013. What began as a scrap of an Idea, has become much more. Pieces of Time, a Musical Trunk Show combines the songs I sing with a "show and tell" style display of approximately 50 collected vintage, antique, and family heritage quilts.

We grew up with our Grandmother in the house. She was a quilter and taught us about color, pattern, and the simple joy of sewing bits of cloth together. She told us stories, and never complained about having us underfoot. We were fortunate to have extended family right up the stairs of that big old house, quietly teaching us without our realizing it.

Our house always had music, too. Mom played the organ at the Baptist church and the piano at home. Dad played classic country music singers on the big HiFi...Hank Snow, Hank Williams, Johnny Cash, Eddie Arnold... and when I was 11 years old, he bought me a guitar. Around that time he began taking Diana to estate auctions. One of the first things she ever bought at one was, you guessed it, a quilt.

Music and quilts. Both have the ability to invoke memories, soothe the spirit, warm the soul, and create community.

Pieces of Time stitches the two together. Through song, story, and 50 - 60 antique quilts, I'll take you along on a happy trip through time and place. You'll laugh, and you'll cry, and maybe view the quilts in your life just a bit differently.

Example:

- If the number 4 is drawn in August, you will have until the meeting in November to complete the project you have listed in the #4 spot on your list and share it with the guild.

Minutes for Stringtown Quilt Guild – June 17, 2021

Welcomed guest and new members.

May minutes accepted.

June Treasurer's report:

- Food pantry collection (\$175) is on hold while we find out if church is going to charge us a set-up fee.
- We are required to have liability insurance for Stringtown Quilters now. Cynthia contacted Hummel-Hatfield for a quote. It was ~ \$410.
 Cynthia wants to pay out of this year's budget. \$1,000,000 policy paying \$50,000 per person. It covers all Stringtown activities: retreats, meetings, Quilter's Day Out, Sit N' Sews, etc. Motion made to purchase the insurance policy and passed.
- Storage space for quilt racks went from \$600 to \$1032/year. Cynthia and the executive committee requested that someone provide storage for \$600/ year and several expressed possible interest. They must be moved before July 8th.

Retreats

- Hometown Retreat is next month, July 29-31, \$25.
 You provide your own meals. 22 have signed up so 6 more can sign up for a total of no more than 28.
- Nov 4-7, Higher Ground money must be paid by Sept 17. Please have roommates because there's not room for singles. \$334/person in single room, \$255/person if there are 2 in a room. This includes 10 meals, and table rental.
- Clifty Falls more information to follow.

Old Business:

- The board would like to increase membership from \$25 to \$30/year. The current balance is approximately \$12,000. It could be approved as part of the budget in August, but motion was made and passed.
- If we want Quilter's Day Out to happen next year, we must have enough volunteers to carry it out.
 We need someone to be in charge and many

committee chairs to do set up, silent auction, books and magazine sales, vendors, demonstrators, publicity, etc. If we don't have enough volunteers by September, we will not be able to do it. First Church is available to host the event. It has lots of room to spread out and there's no charge, except for set-up and cleaning fees. It's on the 3rd Saturday in March. Contact Ann Lightner if you are interested.

New Business:

 Nomination of Karen Evans for President and Robin Bisig for Vice-President. There were not other volunteers. Motions made for them to serve a 2 year term. Passed unanimously.

Linda Whittenburg reminded us to make charity quilts for the Brighton Recovery Center for Women. They need to be lap-sized or larger. The Brighton Center will be here in October to accept them. If they are done beforehand, Linda can take them. Ann Lightner is making a charity quilt using the applique kits previously donated to the guild. See Ann or Cindy if you are interested in making some of the applique squares.

Motion to adjourn made and passed.



Line, Shape, Setting

Take a sleek, strong, clean pieced line beyond its humble roots to accent a form, split a shape, or strike though a construction. Pat Pauly takes the simple line, whether curved or straight, and shows how to use this valuable design element. Both a class for learning the technique of piecing as well as one that offers work in design and composition, it adds the language of the linear form to your work, and you'll learn to make it the star!

Fabrics

8 to 12 fat quarters sized fabrics, or about that size (like a remnant) that a range of darks, lights, brights, and neutrals. They can be prints or solids or a combination. DO NOT BRING YARD PIECES.

Supplies

Sewing machine with normal, regular foot. The usual sewing supplies
Medium or large size mat with rotary cutter
Neutral sewing thread. Optional: Light, dark, and neon color threads for machine
Fabric scissors, pins
6 ½" or 8 ½" square template
