



Minutes for Stringtown Quilt Guild – September 17, 2020

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was held online via Zoom. First, at 7:00 p.m. our speaker, Kris Vierra, gave a presentation via Zoom. The guild's business meeting followed, and it was called to order by President Ann Lightner at approximately 8:20 p.m.

WELCOME

Those in attendance were welcomed.

PREVIOUS MINUTES

A motion to approve the August 2020 minutes was made by Theresa Muth and seconded by Cheryl Cappadona. All were in favor. There were no additions or corrections.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer Cynthia Schmid-Perry sent the treasurer's report with last month's newsletter. There were no additions or corrections, and no one had any questions. The report was filed for audit.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

OLD BUSINESS

Membership – Theresa Muth announced that 42 members have paid their membership dues.

Membership dues can now be paid online. Also, a Facebook page has been created for the guild named Stringtown Quilt Connections, which allows members to buy and sell quilting items online. You have to request to be part of the page, but so long as you are a guild member your request will be accepted.

Membership roster – President Ann Lightner asked every member to let her know if there were any objections to posting your contact information (accessible to members only) so that other guild members can reach you. If there are any objections, please let Ann know as soon as possible and your information will not be shared. Everyone on the Zoom meeting expressed consent to allow their information to be shared. The Membership roster will be available in November.

NEW BUSINESS

October – we plan to present the charity quilts in October. In-person meetings are still cancelled, so the representatives from the charities will be on the Zoom meeting to accept the quilts.

November – a representative from Sulky Thread Company, Eric Drexel, is planning a presentation for us via Zoom.

December – Unfortunately, we are unable to have an in-person Christmas Party this year. In lieu of the Christmas Party, the guild will be providing a Christmas gift to each of the members! Yay!

Quilt Block Challenge – Each year the quilt block challenge allows everyone to submit quilt blocks and the guild members vote on the "best" for each category. This year there is no packet of fabric to purchase, but rather, we can use any Christmas prints in reds, greens, and you may add white, cream or black. The quilt block should measure 12 ½" finished. Pictures will be taken of the blocks and members will be able to vote, possibly through a slideshow (still working on the details).

Sit 'N Sews: You must register online through the Stringtown website. They will be held virtually on Saturday, September 26 and Wednesday, October 14.

Retreats:

Higher Ground – the 2020 retreat is cancelled; deposits will be applied towards next year (November 4 – 7, 2021)

Hotel Millersburg – still on! Must call the hotel directly to reserve your room. If you fail to do so, you may lose your spot.

Clifty State Park – we are currently checking into their policies to see if we will be able to hold a retreat there

Blue Lick – we confirmed that they are able meet social distancing requirements for a retreat if we are interested

No formal adjournment due to running short on time, but the meeting ended at approximately 9:00 p.m.

Each year during Law Enforcement Appreciation month Boone County Schools recognizes our brave officers of the Florence Police and Boone County Sheriff's Department who serve and protect our students and staff <u>year round</u>.

Officer Hill welcomes the students to school and would give Izzy a daily 'high five.' Mrs. Gamble also did a second quilt for Officer Schwartz at RA Jones Middle School. Through his interactions, Officer Schwartz left a positive impression on Mrs. Gamble's husband who is a bus driver for Jones.

Susan Elizabeth Hutcheson chose Officer Travis Brown who serves Ockerman Elementary because her children went to Ockerman and Officer Brown's family lived in their neighborhood.

Many of the stories were personal and have emotional connections for each quilter, each officer or deputy. There is no better time than now to remind our law enforcement men and women that we understand, respect and support the life risking, hard work they do.
